Delaware Healthcare Association Wayne A. Smith President & CEO Thank you for taking a stand against violence to health care workers with the introduction of House Bill 324. The Delaware Healthcare Association (DHA) strongly supports this legislation.

Health care workers have dedicated their lives to caring for others, yet they are more likely than any other workforce to encounter serious assault in their workplace. In fact, health care workers are four times more likely to experience workplace violence than other private industries and 75% of the workplace assaults reported annually happen in the health care or social services settings. Unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic has only increased the frequency and severity of these incidents.

Delaware, like the rest of the nation, is experiencing significant health care workforce shortages. The stress of the pandemic and the surge in violent assaults has taken an enormous toll on our caregivers, both physically and mentally. As a result, many have left the bedside or have made the difficult choice to leave the health care profession all together. We must stand up for our health care heroes.

Under House Bill 324, causing intentional injury against any person providing health care treatment or employed by a health care provider is considered assault in the second degree -- a felony offense. Currently, a felony offense only applies if the injury is inflicted on certain health care providers such as doctors, nurses and EMTs. It does not provide the same protection for other health care workers that come in close contact with patients and their families and who are assaulted. This legislation would ensure that violence against all health care workers (such as a patient safety attendants, nursing assistants, respiratory therapists, etc.) is treated equally as it is for currently protected job categories in the same setting.

DHA is pleased to support HB 324 and looks forward to working with you and the members of the General Assembly to advance this important legislation.
