



As the coronavirus continues to touch — and hurt — almost every aspect of life in

Delaware, the front-line health system industry says it is collectively losing more than \$5 million a day.

Since hospitals temporarily suspended elective procedures, there has been a significant reduction in revenue, health system executives said. Fewer patients are also seeking necessary care, since many are afraid to go to hospitals out of fear of contracting the virus.

Some fear the impacts will be long-lasting. "I have incredible anxiety about some of our members being able to exist ... absent of financial support," said Wayne Smith, president and CEO of the Delaware Healthcare
